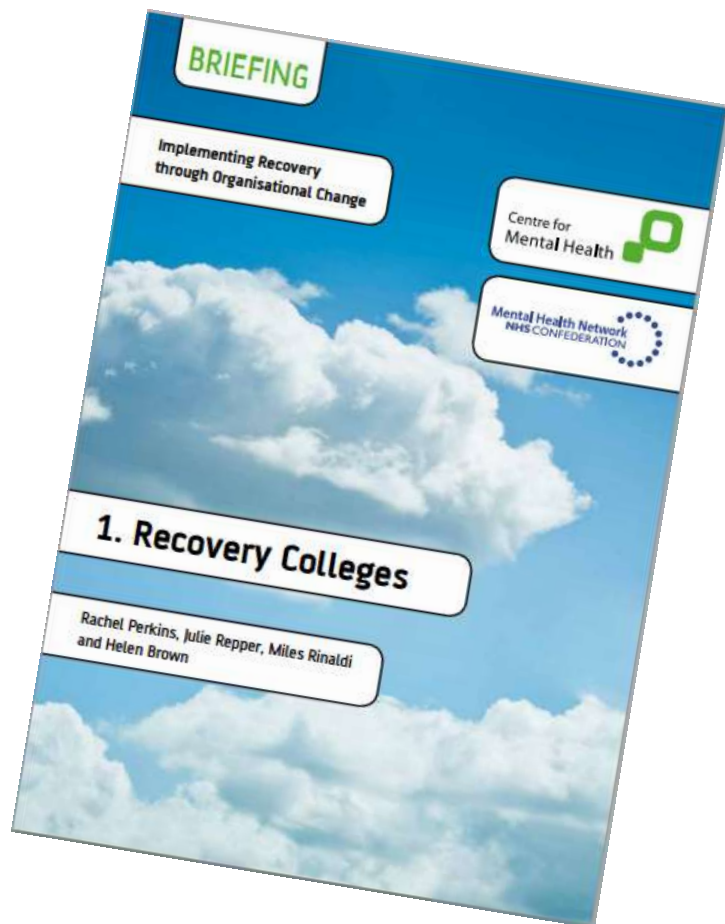

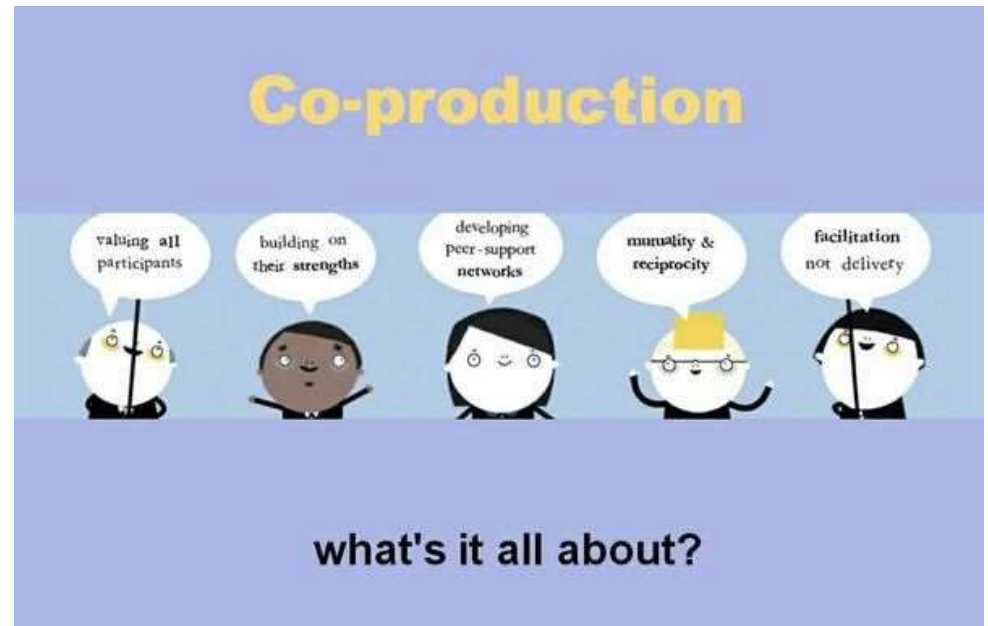
What is a Recovery College?

ORC Today

Key Figures Sep'15-Aug'16

- 330 students have expressed an interest in ORC to date
- 141 active students this year
- 94% of those who attended courses reported being happy or very happy with their experience to date
- 50 sessions run this year
- 212 booked places attended

Term 1 breakdown of student categories:

- SUs = 67%
- Carers = 90%
- Staff = 81%

Term 2 breakdown of student categories:

- SUs = 81%
- Carers = 81%
- Staff = 83%

- Retain existing pool of tutors and optimise tutor satisfaction
